 - b) E-mail dated 31.07.2026 received from CR Legal Firm regarding W.P.(C) No. 10725/2026 titled Gurudev Innovative College of Pharmacy Vs. Pharmacy Council of India and W.P.(C) No. 10687/2026 titled Manniya Kanshiram College of Pharmacy & Paramedical Science Vs. Pharmacy Council of India.
 - c) Order dated 31.07.2026 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in W.P.(C) No. 10667/2026 & CM Appl. No. 49442/2026 titled S.L. Education Institute Vs. Pharmacy Council of India & Ors.
- 10.2 The Executive Committee further noted the judgment dated 29.05.2026 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in LPA No. 614 of 2024 titled *Pharmacy Council of India Vs. SLS College of Pharmacy*, against which the Council has preferred Special Leave Petition (Civil) Diary No. 36158/2026 before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. It was also noted that the Hon'ble Supreme Court, vide its order dated 17.06.2026, declined to grant stay and interim relief in the said matter.
- 10.3 The Executive Committee further noted that several writ petitions have been filed before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi challenging the decision letters issued by the Council, including matters relating to intake/admissions. The Hon'ble High Court has passed various orders/judgments dated 13.07.2026, 20.07.2026, 27.07.2026 and 31.07.2026. It was also noted that the Council filed an appropriate application seeking extension of time for compliance and the Hon'ble High Court, vide order dated 03.08.2026, granted further two weeks' time for compliance.
- 10.4 The Executive Committee further noted that 1634 cases/institutions are still pending for decision of the Executive Committee as on 6.8.2026. Decision as and when received from EC be conveyed to institutions. The detailed list of pending decisions is placed at **Annexure-A**.
- 10.5 After detailed deliberations and taking into consideration the aforesaid judicial pronouncements, the orders of the Hon'ble High Court, the pendency of the SLP before the Hon'ble Supreme Court, and in order to ensure timely compliance with the directions of the Hon'ble Courts, the Executive Committee decided as under:

- a) Updated decision letters shall be issued to the existing approved institutions granting Permanent Approval, wherever applicable, subject to the final outcome of SLP (Civil) Diary No. 36158/2026 pending before the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
 - b) In cases where the decision of the Executive Committee on Inspection Report and/or Appeal is still pending, updated decision letters granting Permanent Approval shall be issued with a specific clarification that such decision is being issued only in compliance with the orders of the Hon'ble Courts and shall not be construed as a decision on the Inspection Report and/or Appeal, which shall be considered separately by the Executive Committee in due course.
 - c) The last intake approved by the Pharmacy Council of India shall stand restored in respect of the concerned institutions, in accordance with the Hon'ble Court directions.
 - d) Decision letters already issued for the academic sessions 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 shall be revised in conformity with the judgment dated 29.05.2026 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the revised decision letters shall be automatically communicated to the institutions through the PCI portal only via adding the point "This decision letter is updated on 7.8.2026" on the same decision letter issued earlier.
 - e) In respect of institutions which have applied for introduction of a new course, increase in intake, or first-time approval, the cases shall be processed and decided on the basis of the Inspection Report(s) for the academic session 2026-2027, the appeal(s), if any, and the applicable statutory provisions and Regulations.

 - d) Decision letters already issued for the academic sessions 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 shall be revised in conformity with the judgment dated 29.05.2026 passed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi and the revised decision letters shall be automatically communicated to the institutions through the PCI portal only via adding the point "This decision letter is updated on 7.8.2026" on the same decision letter issued earlier.
